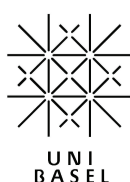

The Inter-University Doctoral Programme in Islamic and Middle Eastern Studies (MUBIT) is a joint doctoral programme of the Islamic and Middle Eastern Studies Departments at the universities of Basel, Bern and Zurich. It is financed by the "Rectors' Conference of the Swiss Universities" (CRUS) for the period 2012-16.

MUBIT strives to find a balance between disciplinary research, thematic interdisciplinarity and openness for transdisciplinary issues. MUBIT is disciplinary as it trains, teaches and supervises doctoral students in Islamic and Middle Eastern studies; it is interdisciplinary as it systematically refers to and cooperates with other disciplines relevant to Islamic and Middle Eastern Studies.
