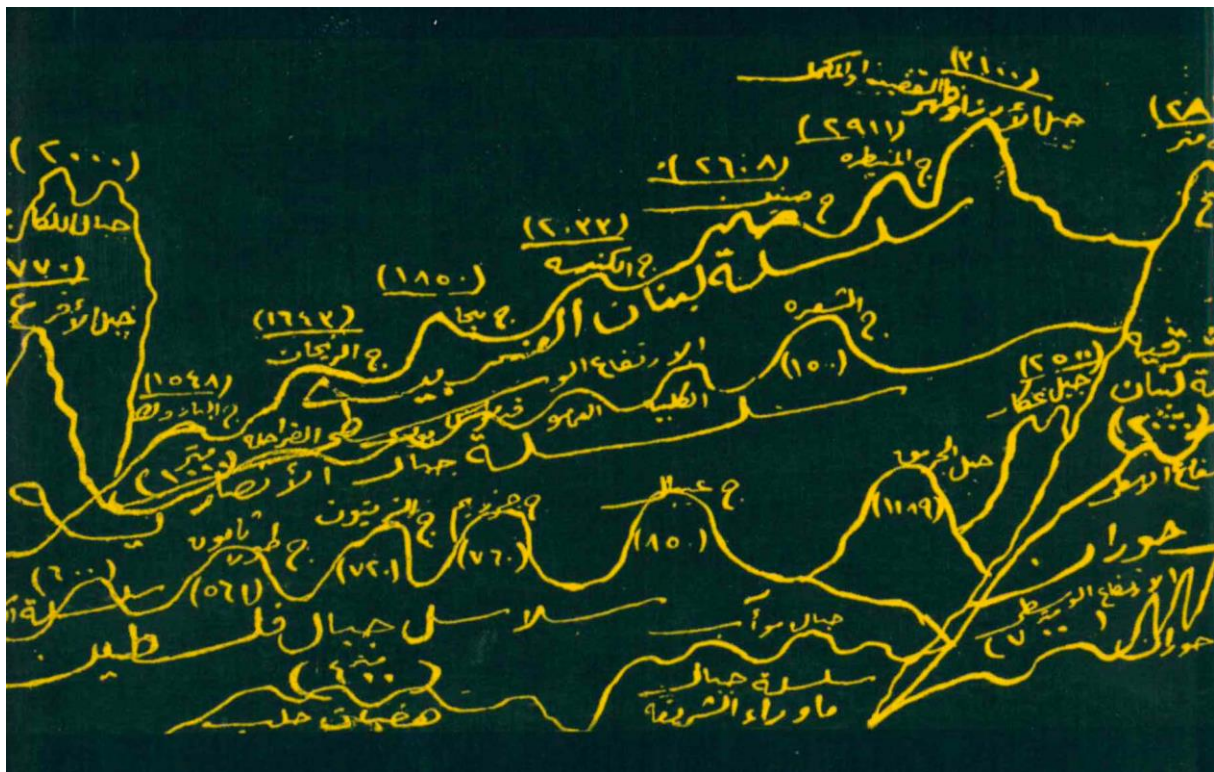

Cyrus Schayegh is Professor of International History at the Graduate Institute Geneva. Before returning to Switzerland, he was Associate Professor at Princeton University (2008-2017) and Assistant Professor at the American University of Beirut (2005-2008). He is the author of *The Middle East and the Making of the Modern World* (Cambridge, Mass. 2017) and *Who Is Knowledgeable Is Strong: Science, Class, and the Formation of Modern Iranian Society, 1900-1950* (Berkeley 2009). His current research focuses mainly on the interplay between post-war globalization and decolonization, Arab views of Afro-Asian decolonization, interwar European inter-imperial cooperation, and historiography.
